



# Terms and Conditions

**What is covered?** The cost of the trip includes round trip airfare from the US— when paid in full by the designated date. For payments made after the designated date, you will be responsible to pay any increase in airfare costs from the hub city.

Also included is your hotel room (based on double occupancy), two meals per day, all internal transportation (unless otherwise noted), and emergency medical insurance. The deposit reserves your spot on the trip based on completed application and acceptance. Gospel for Brazil reserves the right to deny any application.

**What is not covered?** You will be responsible for personal spending money, the cost of snacks, meals on travel days, gratuities where appropriate (waiters, bus drivers, housekeeping, etc.), passport and visa fees, and country exit tax. Gospel for Brazil works diligently to obtain the best possible prices. There are many variable costs beyond our control, we are forced to set a final cost adjustment date (the Designated Date) for each trip at which point there may be a “trip cost increase” of up to 15%.

## **Important payment info:**

- The full trip payment and completed application must be received in our office by the “balance due date” to avoid the late fee.
- For trips that are sold out, your full payment must be received 5 weeks prior to the beginning of the trip or your place on the trip will be given to the next person on the wait list. \$100 of your deposit would be refunded in that case.

## **Donations/Support Funds**

All support funds or donations toward a team member's international trip must be received before the beginning date of the trip. Any funds received on or after the date the trip has begun will be returned to the person submitting the funds.

## **Other comments**

Joe Carr or another GFB representative will teach at most meetings. For some meetings, the team will divide between 2-3 churches and pastors or leaders on the team will be chosen to preach at these churches.

Note: trip expenses may be allowed as a tax deduction because of the missionary nature of the trip. Talk to your accountant to see if this applies to you.
